

It is showy and varied, but it has neither elegance of habit, nor symmetry of form, nor fragrance to recommend it. The most remarkable of the flowers are notorious for their deformity, and although we have now British seedling varieties coming something nearer to a proper standard, we are far from attaining what must be the character of the plant and flower before it can be ranked among the better class of Florists flowers. Although a Chinese plant, our English varieties will soon outnumber and excel the original, and it will be, like the Camellia japonica, essentially English, or, at least, European, before many years pass over our heads. The plants are valuable as out-of door ornaments in mild autumns, for they succeed the dahlia; and although a very severe frost will destroy foliage and flowers, they will live through a frost which will cut off the dahlia past recovery. They are, strictly speaking, half-hardy, but their beauty is frequently spoiled just as they are commencing their bloom. The plants, if grown in the ordinary way, are too tall to be handsome, and the lower leaves wither and turn brown before the blooms come to perfection, even when the season is suitable. This can only be counteracted by means of particular culture, and 49. we can only accomplish an improvement in the habit by carefully counteracting the general tendency of the plant to grow lanky and tall In herbaceous borders, where the subjects are allowed to spread and...
